

OVER 1000 years OF HISTORY...

Arundel's history stretches back to Roman and Saxon times, when it was an important market town and inland port. Today, the town's skyline is dominated by the majestic Cathedral and Castle. Arundel Castle, the seat of the Dukes of Norfolk, dates back to 1068 and is set within 40 acres of sweeping grounds and gardens, including the magnificent Collector Earl's Garden. Open to visitors seasonally, the castle has a full programme of events and activities that can be viewed at arundelcastle.org.

Next to the castle stands the Parish Church of St Nicholas. Built in 1380, it is uniquely divided between Anglican and Catholic worship, with the Fitzalan Chapel accessible only via the Castle Gardens.



AREAS outside ARUNDEL TO explore



Arundel makes the perfect base to explore the local area.

The city of Chichester is just 12 miles from Arundel and is definitely worth a visit for its shops, galleries and history. A historic Roman city, it has a unique blend of ancient heritage and the modern day with its stunning 12th century Cathedral, world-class theatre, and shopping opportunities.

Petworth, 12 miles from Arundel (around a 20-minute drive), is perfect for art and antique lovers and of course, the magnificent National Trust property, Petworth House and Park. The 17th century house boasts a world-class art collection and 700 acres of parkland with views of the South Downs.

Midhurst is just under 20 miles away (30-minute drive), and this charming and historic market town is also worth a visit. Set in the heart of the South Downs National Park there's Tudor ruins to explore at Cowdray Estate, independent shops to browse, an excellent farm shop and scenic countryside walks.

How about a visit to the seaside? A walk along Littlehampton seafront, or in the other direction, there's Bognor Regis with its 2.7 mile promenade and traditional seaside attractions. Why not stop off at The Edge, an award-winning café and roastery on the way.

Outdoor activities, walks, getting on the water and more are all on offer in and around Arundel. The South Downs National Park is on the doorstep, offering short or long walks, bridle paths for horse riding or mountain biking, rolling hills and spectacular views.

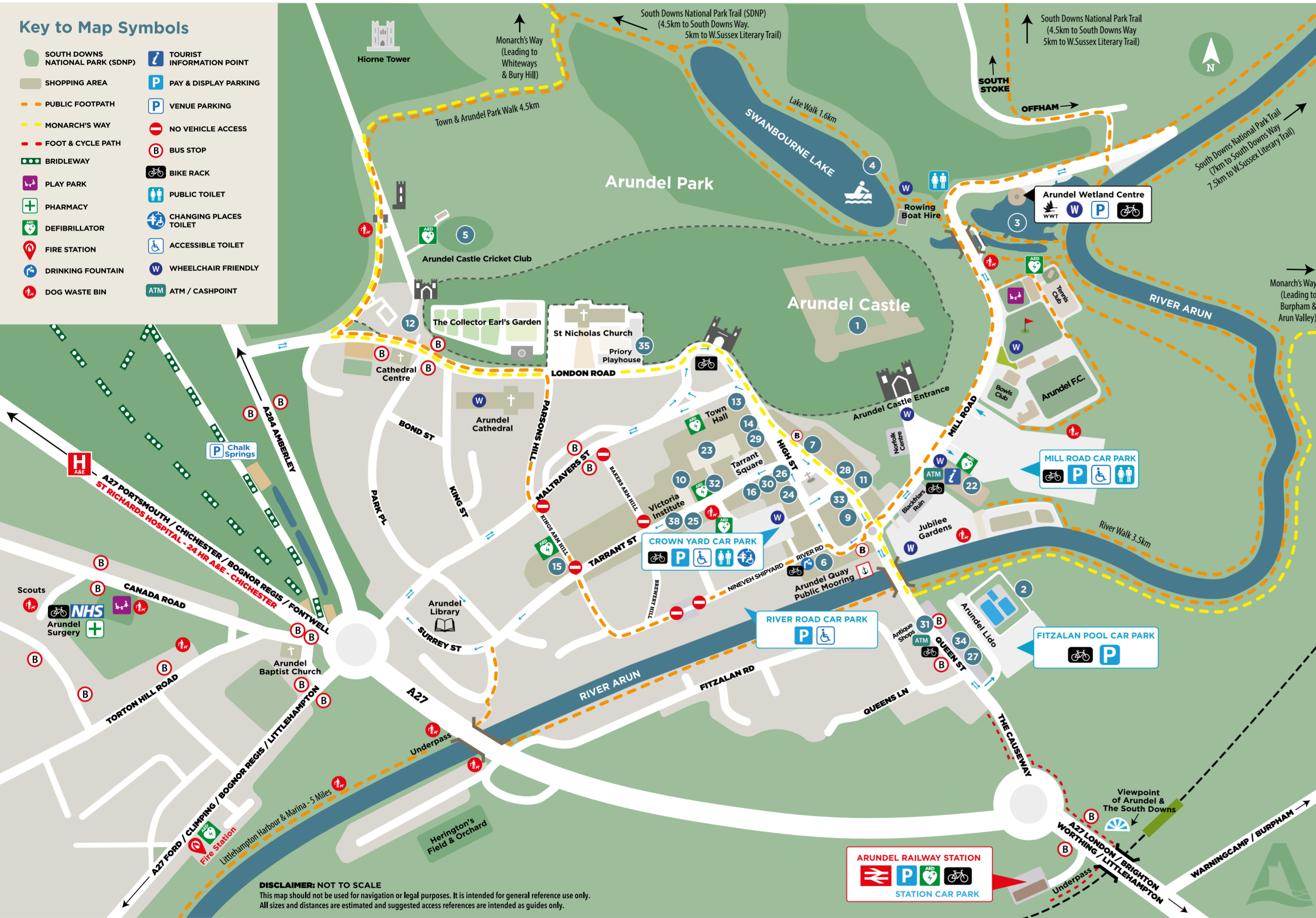

Arundel is easily reached by rail or road. From Arundel Station it's a five-minute walk to the town (taxis are available at the station). Rail links are direct from London Bridge and London Victoria Stations (both 90 minutes travel time) and also Gatwick Airport (55 minutes). Ford Station is 2 miles along Ford Road, providing a direct service to Brighton.

Driving from the west or east, you'll arrive via the A27, from the north, the A29 or A24 (connections nearby). If travelling via the M25, the A3 brings you to the west of Arundel and the A23 to the east.

THINGS to do

Arundel is a small town packed with history, scenery and surprisingly varied things to see and do.

Start with Arundel Castle, an iconic medieval fortress overlooking the River Arun, where visitors can wander grand rooms, gardens and battlements. Just below, Arundel Cathedral offers striking Gothic Revival architecture and peaceful views across the valley. For something slower, stroll through the wetlands of the Arundel Wetland Centre, perfect for birdwatching and relaxed walks.

The town's historic streets are filled with independent shops, antique emporiums, treasure troves and galleries to browse and explore, alongside cafés, restaurants and cosy pubs lining the high street.

If you enjoy the outdoors, walk along the river, explore nearby South Downs National Park trails or take a picnic to Swanbourne Lake. Nearby attractions include a day at the races at Fontwell Park, enjoying a spa day at Bailliffscourt Hotel & Spa, or visiting Aldingbourne Country Centre, a great outing for little animal lovers.

Antiques, art and music, seasonal festivals, farmers' markets, boat trips and glorious countryside make Arundel a wonderful destination to enjoy throughout the year.
